Last Friday we had our Maths open morning, where our adults came and played maths games and Bingo with us. We earned an amazing number of dojos in just one morning.


After maths morning, we performed our poem about the Owl and Pussy-Cat. You will not believe, but most children had a go at learning the poem or a verse by heart. Miss Hawkins and I were super proud of every single one who had a go. Consequently, all the ducks were collected and we enjoyed our class reward of a film, popcorn and hot chocolate on Monday afternoon.



Rowan Class



In art with have been experimenting with using rollers to paint with. We made lots of different marks with them. By using different colours, we created some interesting designs. The paint we used was different to the paint we usually use because it was thicker.





We have also been learning about the skeleton in science. We were interested to find out that babies have 300 bones while adults have 206. Our skeletons keep us upright, protect our organs and help us move. Next week we are going to be comparing animal skeletons to our own.

Oak Class



Another two weeks have passed, and we are now two weeks nearer to Christmas! In the next couple of weeks, Oak Class has some exciting opportunities that we would love YOU to be a part of. As well as an in-school STEM challenge, we will be leading the Christingle service at the church, running stalls at the Christmas Fayre and joining with Rowan class to

lead the Christmas Carol Campfire event. All big responsibilities, but I am sure we will rise to these challenges. Make sure you check Class Dojo for dates and timings!

We have had a great week with BikeAbility this week! The children have been out on the playground and on the road completing their Level 1 and Level 2 Awards. They have been learning about how to ride on the road and the signals they will need to ensure that they are safe. The rest of the children have been designing their own Theme Park, including designing the layout of the rides, budgeting for building the rides and running costs and the profit or loss that the Theme Park would make. They have used their maths and problem-solving skills to do this. We really enjoyed both our weeks mixing our normal curriculum with some enrichment activities.

This week, we have started to look at balanced arguments in English and how we can use evidence to support our ideas and opinions. As well as writing a written argument, we may have a class debate about a chosen topic, using our balanced argument openers and causal and contrasting conjunctions to debate our viewpoints in a professional manner. I am sorry in advance if you hear 'everybody believes that we shouldn't have homework' or '99% of the population think homework is silly' next time the children sit down to do their homework!

Year 6 have also been completing mock SATs examinations this week. They have all tried their absolute best and produced some impressive results! I cannot wait to share their progress with you all at parents' evening. Make sure you have booked a Parents Evening slot. I look forward to meeting with you all!

Time for a good book!


Numenia and the Hurricane by Fiona Halliday


